Section 0511 proctored certification exams on March 2, 2013. The breakout of number enrolled, number of no shows, and number of test takers is:

This was the first exam given at the CSC building. The facility worked very well.

When I enlisted assistant proctors, our number of enrolled test takers was over 40. Most of the people who rescheduled were signed up for the black belt exam. This was an unusually high number of people who rescheduled.

Assistant proctors were Mark Yeo, Suzi Tran, Stephen Santa Ana, David Falletti, and Muzaffar Zaffar. In addition, Paul Mills, Leslie Braun, and David Falletti served as registration assistants.

Two issues have arisen that make accurately reporting additional statistics impossible. First, the membership status of test takers is not always correct on the proctor sign-off sheet. Since members from other sections take exams at our location, and since time is very tight during check-in, the accuracy of the sign-in sheets will be difficult to confirm.

Second, earlier reports on our section's pass rate have relied on the pass lists from ASQ Headquarters. The December 2012 pass lists demonstrate that this is not a reflection of people who took the exam at our section, but instead reflects the pass rate for our section members. In December 2012, we gave the exam to 8 individuals. However, the pass list for that date shows that 16 members of our section passed the exam that day.

Consequently, future reports will not include either the number of members versus non-members or the pass rate until we can determine a better way to collect this information.
