Chair's Corner by Don Burke

On Certification

There are probably a significant number of ASQ members who became interested in the organization for its training and/or certification programs. I, for one was exposed to ASQ's training offerings when I first started in the Quality profession. In fact, I still occasionally refer to the Inspection and Gaging textbook that was part of my first ASQ sponsored training.

My continued interest in ASQ to a large degree lay in the opportunities for Certification, for myself and the staff that reported to me at various times. First there was the Certified Quality Engineer, for which I prepared through the auspices of Section 0511. I contracted for a vendor to provide preparation training for the Certified Auditor examination, for about 20 employees, including myself. I passed the test. I next sat for the Certified Reliability Exam in 1993 and failed miserably. My preparation was with ASQ Section 509, but it was rather disjointed in that no specific text was available to the small study group that convened on a weekly basis. Section 0511's Prep course for Quality Manager served me well and I succeeded on qualifying under that test. Qwest's lunchtime training course to prepare for the Certified Software Quality Engineer helped me achieve that certification.

When I failed the CRE, I swore to myself that someday I would qualify by successfully passing that exam. Prep courses for that examination are hard to find due to the limited audience it attracts. So I began to self-study. Bottom line is I passed the test at the last cycle and now I

am happy to be an ASQ Certified Reliability Engineer. ASQ statistics reveal that collectively the five certifications that I possess should account for a \$57,500 difference in salary. I guess it's about time I pose the Jerry McGuire refrain to my employer and say "show me the money".

What was the difference between the two sittings for the Reliability examination? The Quality Council of Indiana published a CRE primer, which I found to be a useful study aide. Additionally, my children had matured and were capable in teaching me the ins and outs of using the high powered Texas Instruments calculators that they had used in school. Remembering the statistical and mathematical focus of this particular Body of Knowledge, the facile use of the calculator tool was essential.

Recently while reviewing some contract proposals, I noted a claim by a bidder that one of their primary people was one of 323 individuals who had attained a certain set of three ASQ certifications. This assertion caused me to investigate how many people earned the 5 certifications that I possess. The answer, according to ASQ, is 22. This finding was satisfying.

Obviously, I carry a strong interest in the professional certifications offered by ASQ. They are proven to enhance your marketability for jobs. They can also provide a high degree of self-satisfaction in knowing that you have mastered the associated Body of Knowledge. Section 0511 is offering an array of preparatory courses for these examinations. Visit our web site for details on schedules and locations. My belief is that you will be happy with your accomplishments after your have successfully pursued these professional recognitions. -QM

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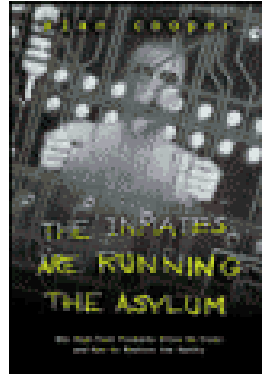

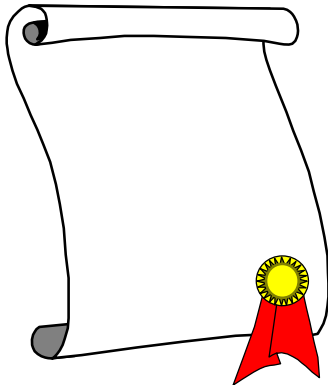
